EVENING SKY

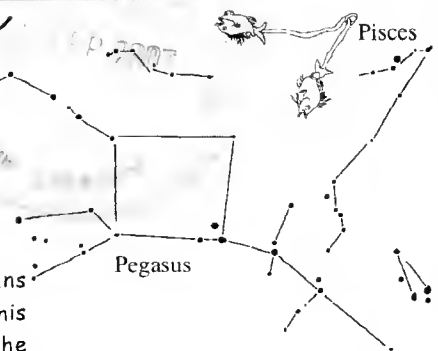
Stars, Oct 03

The sky is awash with constellations related to the sea and its creatures this month. High in the southern sky is the bright star Fomalhaut. It is part of the constellation Piscis Austrinus, the Southern Fish (named by astronomers in the northern hemisphere!).

Between Fomalhaut in the south and the great square of Pegasus high in the north east are several other constellations associated with water. Even Pegasus was an emblem of navigation to the ancient Phoenicians, and the Egyptians saw it as a ship.

Aquarius is between Fomalhaut and Pegasus, Delphinus is leaping overhead and Pisces is rising in the east, just to the right of Pegasus. The shape of Pisces is actually two widely separated fish, joined together by strands of stars in the shape of a "V".

Beyond Pisces (straight east) is another large constellation associated with the sea called Cetus. This sea creature is usually called the Whale, though it was in



the distant past considered a monster the like of which has never been seen on land or sea, and therefore couldn't possibly be a whale. The head is rather kite shaped, at the end of a long body built of a string of stars in a row. A somewhat curious shape to associate with a whale, though the head is large enough!

Planets, Oct 03

Mars is high in the sky all this month. On October 6, Mars is just north of the moon. On the 26th, the bright planet Venus is seen very near the moon in the west (look early in the evening to see it).

Moon, Oct 03

2 October first quarter (overhead at sunset); 10 October full moon; 18 October last quarter (rises at midnight); 25 October new moon
