## ABOUT SUPERLIGA

SuperLiga, a premier tournament that pits the best of the United States against the best of Mexico, returns in 2009 with its third edition. The tournament will be played between June 20 and Aug. 5, 2009, and will include a group phase and a knockout phase with all games held in U.S. venues. Eight clubs – four each from the top-flight leagues of the United States and Mexico – will vie to determine a singular champion of North America.

During the inaugural edition of SuperLiga in 2007, Pachuca defeated the LA Galaxy in a dramatic match decided by penalty kicks at The Home Depot Center. In 2008, an all-MLS final saw the New England Revolution defeat the Houston Dynamo in another memorable set of penalty kicks at Gillette Stadium. During the past two summers, this new competition between rival soccer nations has become an instant hit among millions of soccer fans in Mexico and the United States.

For the 2009 edition of SuperLiga, competitive criteria determined which four teams would represent their respective leagues. The top four MLS teams based on their 2008 regular-season record - who are not competing in CONCACAF Champions League in 2009 - qualified for SuperLiga 2009: Chicago Fire, New England Revolution, Chivas USA and Kansas City Wizards.

The invited FMF clubs, representing Mexico's Primera División, were chosen based on their records (highest number of points) in the 2008 Clausura and 2008 Apertura season, except those teams that qualified for the CONCACAF Champions League. For the FMF clubs who declined the invitation, the next club in line based on points was invited. Therefore, the four participating Mexican clubs are: 2008 playoff contender San Luis, Santos Laguna led by national team star Oswaldo Sanchez, Tigres UNAL led by Lucas Lobos, and Atlas, the young and exciting club led by former Mexican national team coach Ricardo Lavolpe.

### HISTORICAL FACTS

- Santos Laguna played its first-ever match in Segunda División "B" in 1983 and was promoted to the Primera División in 1988-89 ... since that first-ever promotion to the top flight, the club has never been relegated.
- Santos Laguna is the third-youngest team in the Primera División, behind Chiapas and Ciudad Juárez.
- Italian National Team midfielder and Juventus star Mauro Camoranesi began his professional soccer career with Santos Laguna in 1995-96.
- Jared Borgetti, the all-time leading scorer for the Mexico National Team, spent seven seasons with Santos Laguna (1996-2004).
- In the 1996 Invierno competition, Santos won its group and finished second in the general standings ... the club defeated Nexaca, 4-3, in the final of the tournament, giving "Los Guerreros" their first Primera División title.
- In the 2000 Verano competition, Santos again won its group and advanced to the final ... however, Santos fell to Toluca in the championship match, finishing as runner-up.
- In the 2001 Verano competition, Santos won its group and advanced to the final for the second straight year ... in the final, Santos defeated Pachuca for its second Primera División title.
- In the 2008 Clausura, Santos Laguna won its third title, defeating Cruz Azul in the final.
- Santos Laguna advanced to the SuperLiga 2008 competition because of its victory in the 2008 Clausura, but "Los Guerreros" finished last in their group, going 0-2-1 against the New England Revolution, Pachuca and Chivas USA ... the Revolution defeated Santos, 1-0, at Gillette Stadium on July 13 during the group stage of the competition.

## MISCELLANEOUS TEAM NOTES

**REVS OPEN SUPERLIGA TITLE DEFENSE AGAINST SANTOS LAGUNA ...**

After becoming the first Major League Soccer team to raise the SuperLiga trophy in 2008, **the Revolution will begin defense of its crown on Sunday night (June 21)** when the club welcomes Mexican Primera División power **Santos Laguna** to Gillette Stadium ... New England and Santos are joined in Group B of the competition by the **Kansas City Wizards** (MLS) and **Atlas** (MEX), while Group A consists of the Chicago Fire and Chivas USA from MLS, and San Luis and Tigres UANL from Mexico ... **the Revs will host all three of their group-play matches at Gillette Stadium**, including matches against the Wizards (June 24) and Atlas (June 28) following Sunday night's meeting with Santos ... the SuperLiga 2009 semifinals will take place on July 15, and the final will be played on Aug. 5.

**... IN A REMATCH FROM SUPERLIGA 2008**

International competitions such as SuperLiga often provide matchups between clubs which know very little about each other, but that won't be the case on Sunday night when the Revolution hosts Santos Laguna ... **New England and Santos met in the group stage of SuperLiga 2008** (also at Gillette Stadium) **with the Revs emerging victorious**, 1-0, courtesy of **Kheli Dube's** 70th minute goal ... coincidentally, last year's game was the opener for both teams in Group B of the competition, just as it is again this year ... the Revs went on to win the group – and the entire competition – with a record of 2-0-1 (7 pts.), while Santos Laguna finished at the bottom of the group with a record of (0-2-1, 1 pt.).

**MEMORIES OF GLORY**

With the 2009 edition of SuperLiga set to begin this weekend, the Revolution has fond memories of last year's competition, in which **the club won its second-ever cup championship** ... after finishing atop their group with wins over Mexican clubs Santos Laguna and Pachuca – and a draw with fellow MLS side Chivas USA – the Revs earned a hard-fought, 1-0 win over Mexico's Atlante in a heated semifinal match at Gillette Stadium ... that set up yet another championship meeting with the Houston Dynamo, this time on the Revolution's home field at Gillette Stadium ... with the backing of its home fans, New England emerged victorious, earning a 6-5 victory in a thrilling penalty shootout after regulation and extra time finished tied at 2-2.

**REVS WELCOME CHANCE TO HOST ALL THREE SUPERLIGA GROUP GAMES ...**

The Revolution will be thrilled to play all three of its group games in SuperLiga 2009 at Gillette Stadium, as the club has fared much better at home than on the road this season ... while the Revs are just 1-3-3 on the road entering their SuperLiga break, **they are 3-1-1 at home and have outscored their opponents, 9-5, in those five games** ... with just five goals conceded in five home games, New England has **allowed the fourth-fewest goals at home this season in MLS action**.

**... AND HOPE TO REPEAT LAST YEAR'S GILLETTE STADIUM PERFORMANCE**

The Revolution used its home-field advantage to the fullest extent in last year's edition of SuperLiga, going **3-0-1 in four home matches and winning both the semifinal and championship matches on its home field in 2008** ... the Revs defeated both Santos Laguna and Pachuca by 1-0 scorelines at Gillette Stadium in the group stage of last year's tournament, while they also downed Atlante by an identical score in the semifinal in Foxborough ... New England played its fourth and final home game against Houston in the title match, battling to a 2-2 draw through regulation and extra time before emerging victorious in penalty kicks.

**BACK TO EVEN – REVS' RECORD AT .500**

With their 3-1 loss to the Kansas City Wizards last weekend, the Revs dropped back to .500 (4-4-4, 16 pts.) after briefly jumping above the mark with back-to-back wins ... New England now occupies sixth place in the Eastern Conference entering the club's break from the MLS schedule to participate in SuperLiga ... remarkably, there are **currently only four teams in the league with records under .500**, while there are another four teams even at .500 ... despite their current position in the Eastern Conference standings, the Revs still have **games in hand on every other team in the conference, including multiple games in hand on every team except Columbus**.

**REVS TO PLAY FIVE GAMES IN 14 DAYS**

After playing just 12 games in 13 weeks since the club's MLS season opened on March 21, the Revolution will make up for lost time with a hectic stretch of games in the coming weeks ... beginning with Sunday night's SuperLiga match against Santos Laguna (June 21) and ending with a regular-season contest against the LA Galaxy (July 4), **the Revs will play five games in a 14-day span** ... that stretch will include three SuperLiga group stage matches, one U.S. Open Cup game and an MLS regular-season match ... should the Revolution advance to the semifinals of both SuperLiga and the U.S. Open Cup, **the club could ultimately play 11 games in a 35-day stretch from June 21 – July 25**.

**REVOLUTION PUTS REGULAR-SEASON ON HOLD**

Because of the club's participation in SuperLiga 2009, the Revolution will take a break from its MLS schedule for the next two weekends and will have a total of 21 days in between league games ... after playing last weekend against the Kansas City Wizards (June 13), **the Revs won't return to MLS regular-season action until July 4**, when they'll visit the LA Galaxy at The Home Depot Center ... the break from the MLS schedule is the longest for the Revs since their participation in SuperLiga 2008 last July/August.

**RECORD NUMBER OF TEAMS REGISTER FOR FUTBOLITO AT GILLETTE STADIUM**

Futbolito, the official 4-v-4 tournament of Major League Soccer, returns to the New England area on **Sunday, June 21**, and it will do so in record style ... with **more than 225 teams registered to participate**, the New England edition of the tournament has established a **new record** for most teams at one location ... presented locally by MetroPCS, Futbolito will be hosted by the Revolution at Gillette Stadium, marking the **first time in the event's 13-year history that Futbolito will be played on an actual MLS stadium field** ... the tournament is being run in conjunction with the Revs' opening match in SuperLiga 2009 against Mexican club Santos Laguna ... MLS Futbolito is the largest touring multicultural event hosted by a U.S. professional sports league, and is a series of all-day events targeting the league's growing fan base.

**REVS TO HOST HARRISBURG CITY ISLANDERS IN U.S. OPEN CUP**

The Revolution will begin play in the 2009 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup on **Tuesday, June 30**, with a third-round match against the **Harrisburg City Islanders** of USL-2 ... kickoff is set for 7 p.m. at **Veterans Stadium in New Britain, Conn.** ... Harrisburg advanced to the third round with a victory over the Western Mass Pioneers in a penalty shootout on Tuesday, June 16, in a second-round game played in Harrisburg ... the Revs have played four previous matches at Veterans Stadium, boasting a 3-1-0 all-time record ... since 2007, New England is 3-0-0 at the stadium in U.S. Open Cup play, including a victory in penalty kicks over the Carolina RailHawks (USL-1) in the 2007 semifinals.

**THE JOSEPH/RALSTON EFFECT**

While all-star midfielders **Shalrie Joseph** and **Steve Ralston** have served as a makeshift forward pairing in recent weeks, it's tough to argue with their selection when looking at their offensive production ... Joseph has five goals and four assists on the season and has been involved in 60 percent of the Revolution's goals (9 of 15), while Ralston has four goals and four assists and has been involved in 53 percent of the club's goals (8 of 15) ... **overall, either Joseph or Ralston has been involved in all but one of the Revolution's goals this season** (14 of 15, 93 percent) ... the only goal this season that didn't involve Joseph or Ralston in some capacity was the first goal of the season at San Jose (March 21), scored by **Kheli Dube** and assisted by **Jeff Larentowicz**.

**JOSEPH JUST ONE GOAL SHY OF CAREER HIGH ...**

While **Shalrie Joseph** has bounced back and forth between playing as a forward and central midfielder in recent weeks, one aspect of his game has remained constant throughout – he just keeps scoring goals ... starting as a forward against Kansas City last Saturday night, **Joseph scored his team-leading fifth goal** in the Revolution's 3-1 loss to the Wizards ... the goal was scored in the 28th minute, when Joseph met **Steve Ralston's** back-post cross and forced a header between Wizards goalkeeper Kevin Hartman and the post ... **four of Joseph's five goals this season have been scored with his head** ... with five goals on the season, Joseph is just **one goal shy of the career-high mark (6)** that he set in 2006, and the Revs haven't yet reached the midway point of the 2009 campaign.

**... AND SUPERLIGA IS HIS TERRITORY**

With **Shalrie Joseph** currently on a goal-scoring tear, don't expect the Revolution stalwart to slow down during the upcoming SuperLiga competition ... **with three goals in SuperLiga 2008, Joseph was the competition's leading scorer** ... just as four of Joseph's five goals in the 2009 MLS regular season have been scored with his head, all three of his goals in SuperLiga 2008 came via header ... Joseph scored the game-tying goal in the Revolution's 1-1 draw with Chivas USA in the group stage, while he also notched the game-winning goal in the 1-0 win over Atlante in the semifinal ... however, his biggest goal came in the final against the Houston Dynamo, when Joseph scored with time winding down in extra time to knot the game at 2-2 and send the game to penalty kicks.

**REIS HOPES FOR REPEAT PERFORMANCE ...**

Goalkeeper **Matt Reis** will be hoping he can replicate his performance from SuperLiga 2008 in this year's edition of the tournament, as the Revolution's backstop was named the **State Farm Portero Supremo (Supreme Goalkeeper)** last year ... Reis was crucial to New England's title-game triumph, as he stopped 12 shots in regulation and extra time before stopping a pair of penalty kicks in the shootout to lift the Revs to victory ... the veteran netminder finished the competition first in shutouts (3), goals against average (0.56), save percentage (.848) and saves (28).

**... AS DOES RALSTON, WHO LED SUPERLIGA 2008 IN ASSISTS**

Despite only playing in four matches in SuperLiga 2008 after missing the group game against Pachuca with an injury, **Steve Ralston** was crucial in the Revolution's championship run as he **led the competition with four assists** ... all four of Ralston's assists were on either game-winning or game-tying goals ... the veteran midfielder assisted on all three of **Shalrie Joseph's** goals, while he also provided the final pass on **Kheli Dube's** game-winner against Santos Laguna ... Ralston also added one goal in SuperLiga 2008, as he scored New England's first goal in the title match against Houston.

## SUPERLIGA: NEW ENGLAND REVOLUTION VS. SANTOS LAGUNA

### RALSTON STRETCHES SCORING STREAK TO THREE GAMES

With an assist in last weekend's 3-1 loss to Kansas City (June 13), **Steve Ralston** has now recorded at least one goal or one assist in three consecutive games ... during the three-game stretch, Ralston has recorded a total of two goals and three assists ... the veteran midfielder had one goal and one assist in both the Revolution's 2-1 win over D.C. United on May 30 and the 4-0 win over New York on June 7 ... with four goals and four assists in just eight appearances (six starts), Ralston is averaging a goal or an assist per appearance.

### REVOLUTION SIGNS GOALKEEPER BOBBY SHUTTLEWORTH

The Revolution has signed goalkeeper **Bobby Shuttleworth** to a developmental contract, while goalkeeper **Zack Simmons** has been waived, the club announced on June 18 ... Shuttleworth joins the Revs following a brief stint with the Austin Aztex of USL-1 ... he spent three years at the University of Buffalo, starting all 20 matches in his senior season and compiling a 0.63 goals against average and eight shutouts on his way to All Mid-Atlantic Conference honors ... Simmons, who was signed as a free agent on Jan. 30, 2009 after a standout career at UMass, did not make an appearance for the Revs ... he has enrolled in law school at Yale University and will begin classes in late August.

### OSEI SUSPENDED FOR GALAXY MATCH, AVAILABLE FOR SUPERLIGA

Central defender **Emmanuel Osei** was shown a straight red card in the Revolution's 3-1 loss to Kansas City last weekend, and as a result, he **will be suspended for New England's next regular-season match** against the LA Galaxy on July 4 at The Home Depot Center ... however, Osei **will be available for selection in the opening game of SuperLiga 2009** against Santos Laguna on Sunday night, as the suspension only applies to MLS regular-season games.

### LARENTOWICZ GETS DEFENSIVE

While **Shalrie Joseph** has received much praise for his versatility recently - scoring at will as a makeshift forward - his typical partner in the center of midfield, **Jeff Larentowicz**, has proven that he can handle a variety of positions as well ... when **Emmanuel Osei** was shown a red card in the Revolution's 3-1 loss to Kansas City last weekend, **Larentowicz dropped back into the center of defense** and had a strong second half as the Revs kept the Wizards off the board for the final 45 minutes ... the appearance was Larentowicz's first on the backline since **Aug. 26, 2008**, when he played as a central defender against Joe Public FC in the CONCACAF Champions League ... Larentowicz was a defender during the majority of his four-year career at Brown University.

### DUBE RETURNS TO FIELD FOR FIRST TIME SINCE MAY 9

**Kheli Dube** appeared as a second-half substitute in the Revolution's match against Kansas City last weekend, marking the Zimbabwean's **first appearance since May 9** at Chicago ... Dube - who has recorded one goal in eight appearances this season - replaced **Pat Phelan** in the 71st minute ... the second-year forward had been unavailable for New England's previous match against New York (June 7) after returning to Zimbabwe following the passing of his grandmother.

### HEAPS LEAPS INTO THIRD PLACE ON ALL-TIME MINUTES PLAYED LIST

One week after becoming the ninth player in MLS history to make 300 career appearances, **Jay Heaps** climbed into **third place on the league's all-time minutes played** list last Saturday night against Kansas City ... Heaps passed the retired Chris Henderson (26,242) to reach third place on the list and has now played 26,273 minutes in his 11-year MLS career ... when Heaps moved into third place in the 60th minute of the Kansas City match, the top three players on MLS' all-time minutes played list were on the field at the same time ... Revolution midfielder **Steve Ralston** (32,208) is the league's all-time minutes played leader, while Kansas City goalkeeper Kevin Hartman (28,395) is second on the list.

### RALSTON MAKES 400TH PROFESSIONAL APPEARANCE

**Steve Ralston** reached yet another benchmark in his illustrious career last weekend against Kansas City, becoming the **first player in American soccer history to make 400 professional appearances** according to the records kept by the National Soccer Hall of Fame ... the 400 professional appearances includes both MLS regular-season and postseason matches ... Ralston already set the record with his 371st professional appearance at MLS Cup 2007.

### TWELLMAN BECOMES YOUNGEST-EVER TO 100 GOALS

**Taylor Twellman** led the way on an historic evening at Gillette Stadium on June 7, as the Revolution's all-time leading scorer became the **youngest player in MLS history to reach 100 goals** with his 57th-minute strike ... Twellman reached the century mark at **29 years, 100 days**, besting Jeff Cunningham's previous mark (31 years, 360 days) ... Twellman, who also added his 101st goal later in the game, achieved the milestone in just **174 games, fewer than any of the previous four players to score 100 goals** ... the forward has been limited to just two substitute appearances this season while battling on-going medical issues, including severe whiplash stemming from the blow to the head he received while scoring a goal against the LA Galaxy on Aug. 30, 2008.

### DANGEROUS AFTER THE BREAK

Perhaps it's **Steve Nicol's** inspired team talks, or maybe it's simply the chance to regroup, but something has sparked the Revolution during the halftime break this season ... **of the club's 15 goals, seven have been scored in the first 15 minutes of the second half** (between minutes 46-60) ... that's almost 50 percent of the club's offensive production coming immediately following the halftime break ... overall, 11 of the Revolution's 15 goals have been scored in the second half, including three in the final 15 minutes.

### REVOLUTION TOPS IN SCORING PERCENTAGE, SHOTS ON GOAL PERCENTAGE ...

Although the Revolution has taken by far the fewest shots in the league (101), the club has made the most of its opportunities ... the Revs **lead the league in both shots on goal percentage (52.5 percent) and scoring percentage (14.9 percent)** ... the Chicago Fire (50.3 percent) and Colorado Rapids (14.5 percent) are second in the categories, respectively ... the Revolution has hit the target with 53 of its 101 shots, while the club has scored on 15 of those shots.

### ... WITH A TRIO OF PLAYERS LEADING THE WAY

The Revs owe a lot of their success in front of goal to the performances of **Steve Ralston, Taylor Twellman** and **Shalrie Joseph**, who are all in the top 10 in the league in scoring percentage ... **Ralston is third** in MLS with a scoring percentage of 44.4 percent, having scored four goals on just nine shots ... **Twellman is fifth** (40 percent) with two goals on five shots, while **Joseph is eighth** (33.1 percent) with five goals on 16 shots ... Kansas City defender Aaron Hohlbein and Toronto defender Adrian Serioux lead the league (50 percent) with two goals on four shots.

### KEEP IT CLOSE

As part of the hallmark of head coach **Steve Nicol's** coaching style, the Revs have been one of the best teams in Major League Soccer in tightly contested games this season ... New England has won all three of its games which have been decided by a single goal, while they've drawn another four matches, including three in hostile road environments ... **the Revs are the only team in the league to be perfect in one-goal games.**

### USING THEIR HEADS

Of the Revolution's 12 goals scored from the run of play this season, seven have been scored via header ... the Revs have scored 15 goals in total, but three have come from the penalty spot ... **Shalrie Joseph** has scored four of the Revolution's seven headed goals, while **Taylor Twellman, Steve Ralston** and **Kenny Mansally** each have one.

### MAN-GAMES LOST CONTINUE TO PILE UP

Although the Revs are finally nearing a return to full health, they've still dealt with an astonishing injury list through the first half of the season ... **the Revolution has lost 57 man-games because of injuries 12 games into the season**, which works out to an average of **4.75 man-games lost per game** ... **Mauricio Castro** and **Gabriel Badilla** (12 each), **Taylor Twellman** and **Chris Albright** (10 each), **Matt Reis** (5) and **Steve Ralston** and **Kevin Alston** (4 each) have all missed multiple games because of injury this season, while Albright has missed an additional game because of suspension ... the Revs lost 94 man-games because of injury last season, while they lost a remarkable 154 man-games in 2006.

### COUNTDOWN TO 100: NICOL EARNS CAREER WIN NO. 91

With the Revolution's 4-0 victory over New York on June 7, head coach **Steve Nicol** earned the **91st win of his career** ... Nicol is currently **third all-time on MLS' career wins** list behind only Bob Bradley (124) and Sigi Schmid (118) ... now in the midst of his eighth season in charge of the Revolution, the Scot is the longest-tenured head coach in Major League Soccer ... a Liverpool legend from his playing days, Nicol has been remarkably successful during his stint at the Revolution's helm, winning four Eastern Conference championships and appearing in six Eastern Conference Finals in his first seven years of service.

### ADDITIONAL SEATS RELEASED FOR MILAN DERBY ON JULY 26

Additional premium seats have been released for the AC Milan-Inter Milan match that will be played at Gillette Stadium on Sunday, July 26 ... the newly-released seats are in the West Fidelity Investments Clubhouse, and each ticket includes a VIP pass to the teams' training sessions on Saturday, July 25 ... the special premium packages are **on sale now for \$125 each** ... the match is part of a six-game event - the World Football Challenge - which will be played in stadiums across the country and will feature AC Milan and Inter Milan from Italy, Club America from Mexico and Chelsea from England.
