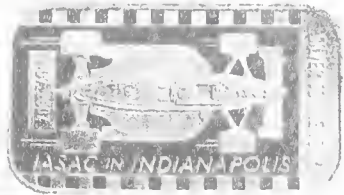

In the annual membership drive, Ralph Steffen came in with twelve new members and won the gold-plated bar. Mike Sprouse and Laila Taavola each



brought in five new members and received the silver bar. Thanks for their efforts to grow the club. We will continue these same contests in the future, so this is a challenge to all of you to recruit new members, young and old.

Later on, we continued in a social vein, meeting at El Cholo for dinner. Linda Spellman and her fiance Tony Guarino joined us there for a bountiful meal and great conversation.

There are also a lot of minor attractions that are reasonable and interesting. Also, we will have blocs of time set aside for members each day as well.

The ad rates for the Silver Bugle were discussed. The concensus of the Board would be that advertisers would only be able to advertise hobby related items. Also a 50 % surcharge would be charged to non-members.

A questionnaire should be included In the August issue of the Silver Bugle to see what interest there would be in silver rectangle albums if we could find a producer. Currently, Whitman makes a silver round album. We are gathering information right now but the question would be how many would you buy? Would it make a difference if it had the IASAC Logo?

We are also getting prices on a commemorative holder for our IASAC silver issue.

The Board is in favor of swapping newsletters and memberships with other Numismatic clubs.

Also, what, if any items would you be interested in purchasing with the 25th Anniversary Logo. Coffee Mugs, caps, shirts, nice pens, folios, etc. There is a vendor that could would do caches if there is enough interest. We need to know by Sept. 30 if you have any input. The Board also was in agreement that any new members that signed up at the Conventions could sign up for the renewal rate.

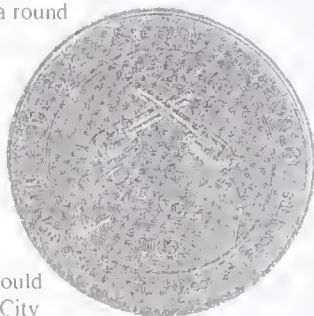

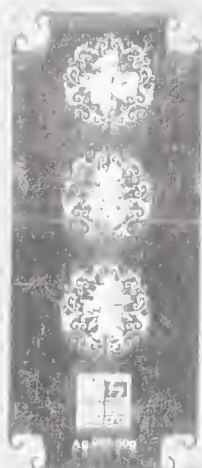
